The committee, currently comprised of the Foundation's four life trustees and three atlarge trustees, reviews grant requests and provides strategic direction for the Foundation's programmatic investments prior to final board approval.

Humphrey serves as a regional corporate responsibility officer at KeyBank N.A. In this role, she is in charge of community investment programs in Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse and oversees the local execution of KeyBank's \$16.5 billion community benefits plan. She also leads KeyBank's partnership in the Eastside Innovation Zone with the Buffalo Public Schools.
